We are proud to announce that the **1st Asia Pacific Congress on Controversies to Consensus in Diabetes, Obesity and Hypertension (CODHy)** will take place in Shanghai, China on June 2-5, 2011.

The success of the 1st and 2nd World CODHy Congresses, which took place in Europe, paved the way for the 1st locally oriented CODHy Congress, which was held in Buenos Aires in 2010.

The 1st Latin America CODHy Congress was a vibrant academic event with a regional focus and attracted approximately 2000 participants from 52 countries.

Academically, the 1st Asia Pacific CODHy Congress will raise the most dynamic and controversial topics facing clinicians in the fields of Diabetes, Obesity and Hypertension in an exciting debate forum.
